Purpose of policy

This policy acts as a guide to developing the Emirati students' standards and achievements to:

- Ensure that Emirati students receive a high-quality education while preserving their cultural identity.
- Promote and ensure the Emirati students' development, progress, and wellbeing is considered at all levels.
- Define and develop a clear approach to ensuring all of our Emirati students have the opportunity to succeed at BWA.
- Further develop career pathways and career aspirations to support our Emirati students.
- Promote the importance of the involvement of Emirati parents and carers in the life and learning of the school.

Aims and objectives

The main aim of the policy is to put forward an ambitious and courageous vision that highlights the importance of preparing future generations who are ready to serve their communities and excel and innovate in all areas, and optimising the educational experiences, achievements, potential and aspirations of each Emirati student, ensuring that they gain the knowledge and develop the skills that will allow them to fully contribute to the realisation of the national vision.



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School core targets

- Wellbeing: We will establish a support system to address the unique social and emotional needs of Emirati students, promoting their well-being and mental health within the school environment.
- Progress and attainment:
 - Identify Emirati students who require additional support and implement tailored intervention strategies.
 - Recognise and celebrate the outstanding progress made by Emirati students. Involve students, as appropriate, to encourage them to take ownership of their targets.
 - Develop and implement EEP for Emirati students.
 - Ensure that all Emirati students have an Emirati Personalised Education and Support Plan (PESLP)
 - Regularly update TEAMS individual files with relevant data and student work samples.
 - Ensure that all the Emirati students' progress is tracked, monitored and reviewed regularly to ensure targets are likely to be met. Evaluate the effectiveness of strategies and interventions and introduce new ones as needed.
- Attendance: Strive to achieve a minimum attendance rate of 94% for all Emirati students, with an aspiration for an outstanding 100% attendance.
- Parent involvement: BWA values the involvement of Emirati parents and guardians in their child's education. Regular communication channels will be established to encourage their active participation in school activities and decision-making processes.

Roles and Responsibilities

- Leadership Team: To provide vision and ethos. To monitor and evaluate the impact of the policy.
- Subject, Grade, and Assistant Head: to meet regularly with their Emirati students, monitor their progress and offer enrichment opportunities.
- Teachers: to monitor within their class ensuring that all students are stretched and challenged.
- Parents: Engage with their children at home, offering support, guidance, and enrichment opportunities. Regularly check for school updates, announcements and events through the school portals.

Monitoring and review

This policy will be periodically reviewed by the school leadership team and teaching staff to assess its effectiveness and relevance. Feedback from Emirati students, parents, and staff will be considered during these reviews.
